This voluntary role will give you a unique opportunity to work alongside the College Principle and Heads of Departments, giving you an insight into the decision making process of a major multi-million pound organisation.

Alongside this you'll have the opportunity to learn about stakeholder management and how long term strategy planning can impact on different communities including both current and future students.

Reporting to the College Council – which is responsible for the overall strategy and policy-making process at the University – the Academic Board make decisions regarding the academic experience on campus.

In plain English, that's looking at the teaching, examinations and research taking place at Royal Holloway and mapping out their impact on you and your fellow students.

It is expected that you will attend Academic Board meetings across the year - there's a minimum of one per term.

Any registered student is eligible to be a candidate for the role of Academic Board Rep.
