Royal Holloway Students' Union (RHSU) exists for one simple reason: to make student life better at Royal Holloway. It's this vision that guides everything we do as an organisation and we firmly believe that with the right people and a commitment to our values we can deliver huge change on campus.

And that's where you come in. As a candidate for the role of College Council Representative you've taken the first step towards representing the interests of the student body.

If successful in your campaign you'll join the Union's President in sitting on the 25 member council and become a trustee of Royal Holloway as a charity.

This voluntary role will give you a valuable insight into how a multi-million pound organisation sets their long term strategic direction, the steps taken to safeguard the College's financial and academic sustainability and ensure that policies and processes are properly executed.

The Principal and Students' Union President are ex officio members of the council while the remaining panel is made up of:

- 16 external appointments bringing a wide range of skills and experiences with them
- 3 members elected by non-academic staff
- 3 members elected by the academic staff
- 1 student member elected by the student body

It is expected that you will attend the five College Council meetings that take place across the course of the year. These meetings usually last for no more than three hours although preparation in advance is required.

Any registered student is eligible to be a candidate for College Council Rep.

- Ensure the student interests are represented to the Council

Is it true you can only run for one role in the elections?

You can in fact run for multiple roles, but only in certain circumstances.
