Royal Holloway Students' Union exists for one simple reason: to make student life better at Royal Holloway. As a registered charity with a turnover of approximately £5m, it employs nearly 50 permanent staff and over 350 student staff, delivering a range of services from bars, shops, an advice centre, sports clubs, societies, media groups and supporting academic reps and campaigners.

ROLE DETAILS.

NUS (which stands for the National Union of Students) delegates represent the views of Royal Holloway students at NUS National Conference - where people from all over the country come together as a national movement to debate, discuss and agree ideas.

NUS Conference takes place each spring, runs for three days and has almost 1400 people attending. This year the conference is being held in Glasgow and will run from 9 - 11 April.

All delegates would need to be available to attend on these dates.

There will also be a range of 'fringe' events during the breaks which will look at national campaigns and other activities.

All expenses are paid for your attendance, including travel, accommodation and registration.
